

The Joule Centre

The Joule Centre for Energy Research is a partnership of Northwest Universities, commercial organisations and other stakeholders associated with the energy industry. It has emerged out of the complimentary strengths of the participating organisations across a range of disciplines and energy areas. The Vision of the Joule Centre is:

“To create an internationally-leading energy research centre in England’s Northwest which will significantly increase the region’s research capacity and activity in key areas of new sustainable energy technologies, supporting science and technology, energy efficiency and integrated assessment of the energy system”

The Joule Centre will provide a focal point for the NW to make a growing contribution to national and international challenges in the field of sustainable energy R&D and to attract an increasing share of available funding. It will capitalise on the regional knowledge base in both academia and industry to develop an innovative R&D agenda that will support the work of the Northwest Energy Council and exploit opportunities in energy systems and technology development that are relevant to the NW.

Invitation for Research Proposals

The Joule Centre now wishes to invite proposals for research projects from eligible organisations within the area of the North West Development Agency.

Subject

The Subject of this 1st Call is “Marine Energy and Wet Renewable Technologies”. Proposals may address wave, tidal, tidal barrage and other Marine Energy and Wet Renewable Technologies.

Budget

The budget of this 1st Call is £600,000 and it is anticipated that more than one grant will be made. Projects may extend over periods of up to 3 years. Co-funding or the demonstrated potential for future co-funding of the area of research is considered to be highly desirable.

Selection Criteria

The selection criteria will include:

- Scientific and technological excellence of the proposal.
- Demonstrated value to the Northwest including exploitation and dissemination
- Track record of the Investigators and their collaborating organisations
- Value for money including the potential for co-funding
- Clear milestones and deliverables

Submission of Proposals

Proposals should be submitted via email to the Joule Centre Administrator by 17:00 on 10th February. Electronic copies of the Application Form and a Funding Guide are available from the Joule Centre Administrator.
